

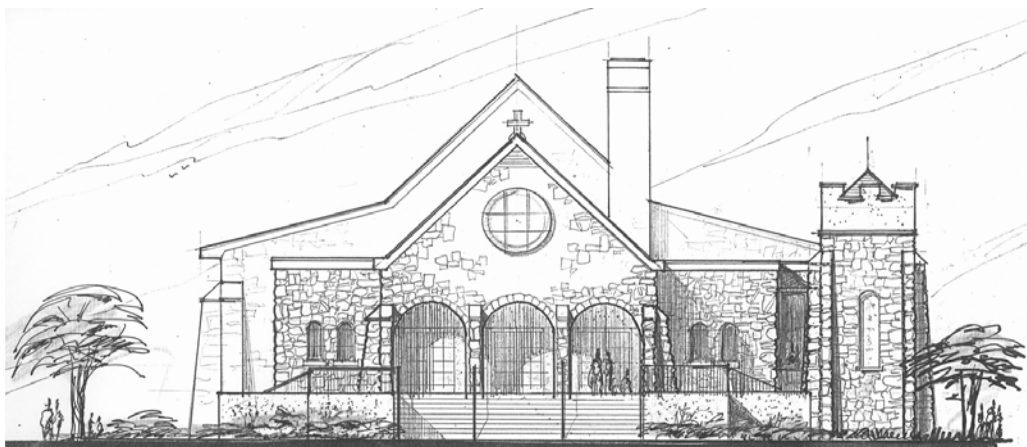
HIS WORD TODAY

Fifth Sunday of Lent
March 18, 2018

“Some Greeks who had come to worship at the Passover Feast came to Philip who was from Bethsaida in Galilee and asked him ‘Sir we would like to see Jesus.’ Philip went and told Andrew, then Philip and Andrew went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them ‘the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat, but if it dies, it produces much fruit.’”

It is not rare for someone to use another to get help to get a job, admission to school, or even just to meet someone of importance. In the political field we call them lobbyists. Today we find some Gentiles using Philip, and he another apostle to gain access to Jesus. The same Andrew is the one who told Peter he had met Jesus and we know how important that meeting was.

How many other persons are seeking Jesus, today without knowing it or Him. They have need for access to the Lord. Our restless world turns, but people do not know to whom to turn. Each one of us can assume the role of Philip or Andrew, to bring them to Jesus or Jesus to them. The grain of wheat will then produce much fruit.

Message from Fr. Bill

In Lent we have been professing our faith using the Apostle's Creed. A common question asked concerns the meaning of the statement that Jesus descended into hell. This fact of the creed reveals the depths of God's love for us. I want to share a teaching that helps put things into context and then I want to share from the Catechism.

St. Gregory of Nazianzus clarified the Church's teaching about Jesus when he taught: "What has not been assumed (by Jesus) has not been healed." St. Gregory gave great prominence to Christ's full humanity; to redeem humans in the totality of his body, soul and spirit, Christ assumed all the elements of human nature, otherwise humans would not have been saved. We read in Scripture: He was like us in all things but sin. (Hebrews 4:15). We also read: He who knew no sin became sin for us. (2 Cor 5:21) So Jesus, in order to save us, assumed all that it means to be human and furthermore he assumed all the punishments due to sin-including descending into hell.

As the Catechism teaches: The Apostles' Creed confesses in the same article Christ's descent into hell and his Resurrection from the dead on the third day, because in his Passover it was precisely out of the depths of death that he made life spring forth. The first meaning given in the apostolic preaching to Christ's descent into hell: that Jesus like all men, experienced death and in his soul joined the others in the realm of the dead. But, he descended there as *Savoir*, proclaiming the Good News to the spirits imprisoned there. Scripture calls the abode of the dead, to which the dead Christ went down, "hell"- because those who are there are deprived of the vision of God. Such is the case for all the dead, whether evil or righteous, while they await the redeemer: It is precisely the holy souls, who awaited their Savior in Abraham's bosom, whom Christ the Lord delivered when he descended into hell. Jesus did not descend into hell to deliver the damned, nor to destroy the hell of damnation, but to free the just who had gone before him. The descent into hell brings the gospel message of salvation to complete fulfillment. By the expression, "he descended into hell," the Apostles Creed confesses that Jesus did really die and through his death for us conquered death and the devil. In his human soul united to his divine person, the dead Christ went down to the realm of the dead. He opened heaven's gates for the just who had gone before him.

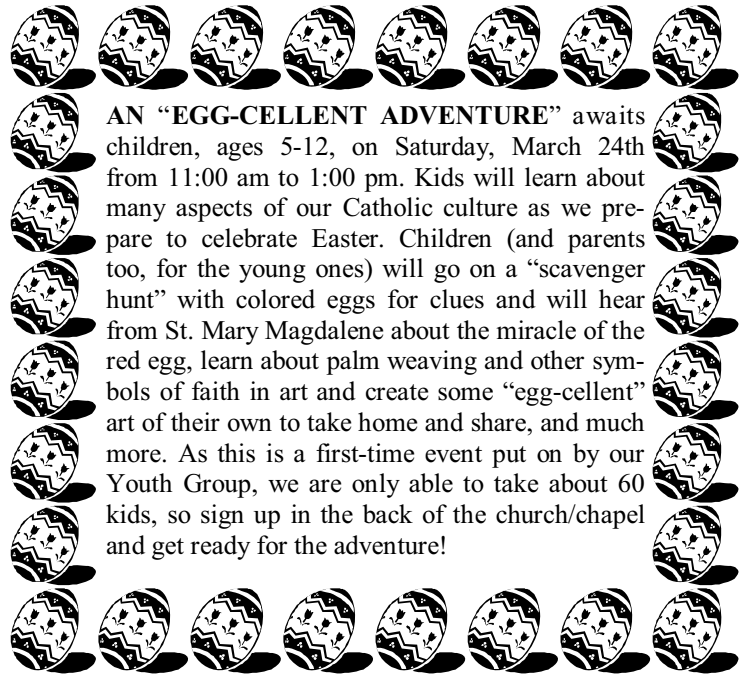
