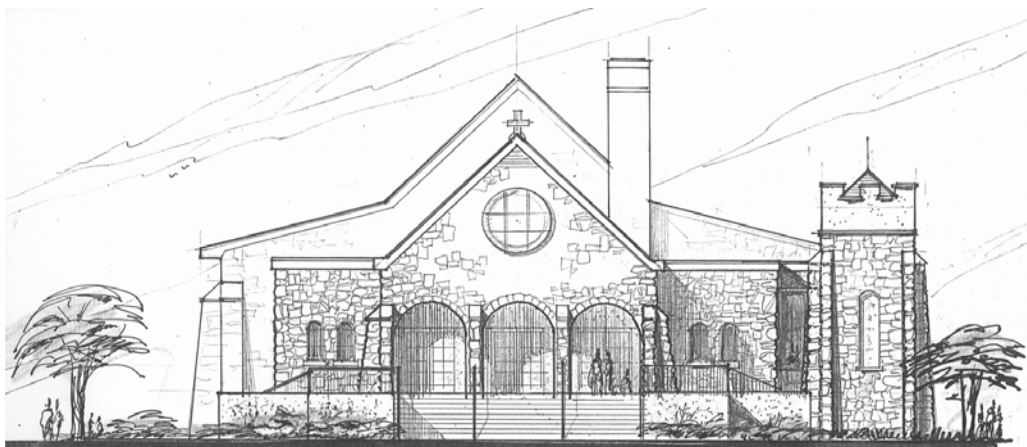
**Easter Sunday of the
Resurrection of the Lord
April 1, 2018**

“Peter proceeded to speak and said; ‘You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did... they put him to death hanging him on a tree. This man God raised up on the third day and granted that he be visible not to all but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance who ate and drank with after he rose from the dead.’”

We can listen to many Easter sermons, telling of the events and appearances of Jesus. We visit the upper room with the apostles, meet Him with Mary in the garden, breakfast with Him on the shore of Tiberias, and share an evening meal in Emmaus. All are witness stories.

The Pentecost sermon of Peter summarizes the event of Easter and its meaning for the witnesses. He was anointed with the Holy Spirit so we too have been confirmed. He was filled with power, so too we who live the life of grace. He went about doing good, the work of the church and we missionary disciples today. We too are the chosen witnesses of the Risen One who eat at His table, breaking the bread of life.

Easter faith tells us that He lives and among us. Easter joy fills us with a special enthusiasm. Easter commissioning sends us to bring that joy to others.

A Message From Father Bill

Happy and Blessed Easter to you all.

I have not had an installment of "View from the Pew" in a while. I thought this Easter Sunday would be a significant time to bring this feature back to you. I met Paul Garvey shortly after I arrived here at St. Denis. We quickly became friends – both in faith and in humor. You probably have seen "the man with the wheelchair with the American flag" both in church as well as in town. There is a story behind this for sure. And, so I give you Paul's "View from the Pew."

On June 12th 2010, I had a tragic diving accident. I dove into the Great South Bay, Long Island, off a boat thinking the water was deep, but actually I dove onto a sandbar, suffering a traumatic brain injury and breaking my neck. I was brought to Northshore Hospital, where I was in a coma for two months. When I came out of the coma, I was taken to Kessler Rehabilitation Center in West Orange. I had six major surgeries at the Hospital for Special Surgeries, NY. I stayed at Kessler for two years. While there, in a new way, I learned about Love, Faith, Hope, and one thing we don't always talk about... Courage.

For me, having this tragic accident, believe it or not, has been so life changing for the good that I would never change it. I appreciate everything, more than I ever did. I learned more about myself and about my Faith than I ever thought I could. Love, Faith and Hope gave me the courage that I needed to get me through. And, they helped me towards my new outlook on life. My life is more beautiful than it ever was before the accident.

I appreciate the people of my parish and my town. You are all so kind, helpful and friendly, and this is just not talked about. With my kind of injury, there is not a big chance at having independence. But, I can have it here in Manasquan and Brielle. I appreciate that I live here in a small town that also has such great resources, like Kessler Rehabilitation, and such good people who live here. I hope you can appreciate that. I don't take this fact for granted.

I appreciated God before what happened to me, but I appreciate God so much more now. He has become so strong a presence in my life, more than ever before. In everything I do, I count on Him to help me. For me, courage is inside everybody, you can't have the "woe is me" attitude. You have to dig deep and find the courage that everyone has inside them.

On this Easter Sunday, we renew our Baptismal Promises. We remember the gifts of Faith, Hope and Love that God gave us at our Baptism. For me, Faith, Hope and Love "add up" to give us Courage. I think of Jesus and all He did for us with carrying the cross and He had a lot of Courage. His Courage came from His Faith, Hope and Love for the Father and for us.

Faith is something we believe in and lets us pray and gives us Hope for our future. You have to be the hopeful person who encourages people to do things again for their well-being. I did this during my time at Kessler and I try to do it now. If someone has an injury or is hurting in some way, I try to inspire them to find the courage that they need. I share my experience of needing Faith, Hope, Love. For me, life is more beautiful the second time around. If you just get up and thank the Lord that you did get up and inspire others to have a better outlook on life, if you inspire just one person a day, than it really is a blessed thing. Easter reminds us about the new life God offers us. I am thankful for the new life God has given me. I hope you have a Happy Easter.
