

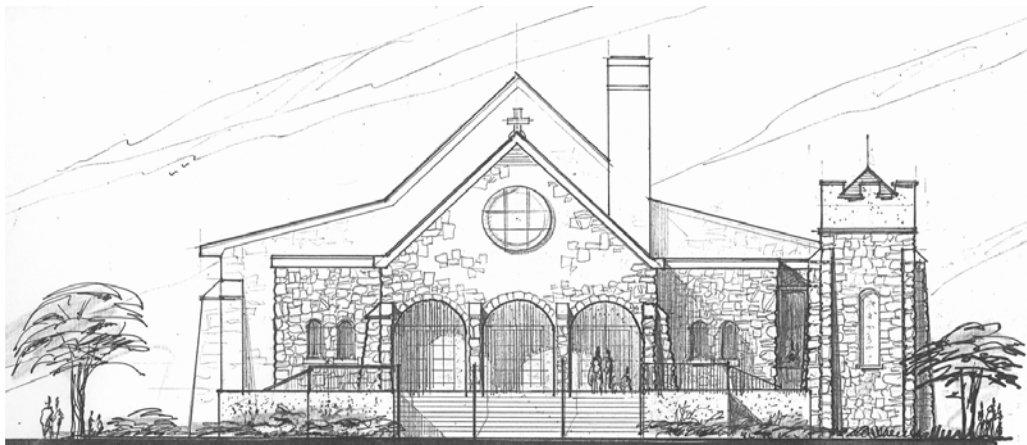
HIS WORD TODAY

Message from Fr. Bill

I write to give the Code of Canon Law regarding the choice of godparent/sponsor for Baptism and Confirmation. The Church is the one who defines who a godparent is. Each week we get calls from people who ask someone to be a godparent first, before finding out the definition and requirements. The Code of Canon Law cannot be changed by me; it is not an opinion, it is the rule we follow. Those who wish to be a member of the Catholic Church ascent to following the Catholic Way that we are given by Jesus and His Church. Please read the following information before you choose a godparent and/or share these facts with someone who is preparing to have a child baptized. There is never a judgement of a person who cannot be chosen as a godparent, there is only an assessment that a person does not meet the requirements of godparent as the Church defines because their own choices have made them non-eligible. (In #4 below, choices people make that would lead to someone to "be bound by any canonical penalty" includes: people cohabitating without marriage, people married outside the Catholic Church and have not had their civil or non-Catholic marriage convalidated in the Catholic Church.) Canon Law reads as follows:

Canon 872 Insofar as possible, a person to be baptized is to be given a sponsor who assists an adult in Christian initiation or together with the parents presents an infant for baptism. A sponsor also helps the baptized person to lead a Christian life in keeping with baptism and to fulfill faithfully the obligations inherent in it.

Canon 873 There is to be only one male sponsor or one female sponsor or one of each.

Canon 874 §1. To be permitted to take on the function of sponsor a person must:

1/ be designated by the one to be baptized, by the parents or the person who takes their place, or in their absence by the pastor or minister and have the aptitude and intention of fulfilling this function;

2/ have completed the sixteenth year of age, unless the diocesan bishop has established another age, or the pastor or minister has granted an exception for a just cause;

3/ be a Catholic who has been confirmed and has already received the most holy sacrament of the Eucharist and who leads a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on;

4/ not be bound by any canonical penalty legitimately imposed or declared;

5/ not be the father or mother of the one to be baptized.

§2. A baptized person who belongs to a non-Catholic ecclesial community is not to participate except together with a Catholic sponsor and then only as a witness of the baptism.
