

A Message from Fr. Bill

As we continue in our Easter season, I continue to pray each day for all of you. I wanted to update you on what has been happening here at St. Denis and also give you some food for thought.

Our parish staff is working, with precautions in place. I want you to know that we are here for you. We spread out who works from home and who is in the office, so please call or email to arrange what you need. I offer daily Mass for all and to honor the intentions that have been requested for each of the Masses. In addition, I continue to offer private Mass for those who have died, until their families can gather for funeral Masses at a later date. I also have been meeting with people for pastoral outreach, pastoral counseling, spiritual direction, marriage preparations etc., just on the phone, or occasionally in person, with precautions in place (feel free to call for a time to talk if you'd like). We also continue to have postings on Facebook throughout the week along with updates on the website, and we post our bulletin on the website (as our bulletin company has been closed due to the pandemic).

There has been a great need to reschedule our parish calendar for many weddings. Fall will be busy! We are still in a holding pattern for choosing new dates for those who would have celebrated First Communion and the Sacraments of the Easter Vigil and we must wait to see if Confirmation will also need to be rescheduled. We know that we will be celebrating these Sacraments, necessary for salvation, but must await for the "go-ahead" from our Bishop. We will let you know as soon as we can.

There has been painting of the parking lot and the cafeteria and other such projects, so that things will be ready for you upon your return to Masses and parish functions. Thankfully, I have been able to pay the bills of the parish, through the generosity of so many and by making decisions to cut costs. Certainly, our weekly collections are less than usual and our Easter Collection was drastically less than previous years. But, as the final work for the church repairs has been put on hold, due to social distancing concerns, so I have also been able to count on moneys we had put aside for that purpose to help us at this time. I ask for your continued donations for the parish, as your means permit.

I am so happy for all of the great work of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. So many donations continue to pour in, both money and bags of groceries (nothing perishable please). It is an amazing sight, repeated several times a day, of people driving up to the rectory front doors and carrying up bags of food for our increasing number of neighbors in need. Thank you for such a showing of "faith and love in action."

With that last statement in mind, I would like to leave you with a few reflection questions, namely: *How has the pandemic affected your faith/hope/love?* and also *How has your faith/hope/love affected the pandemic?* I think both sides of that equation need to be looked at by each of us. To reflect on the effect of the pandemic on your spiritual life and also how you have used your spiritual life in this pandemic. From both of these questions stems a few more, namely: *What have you learned from this experience, thus far? What/who has inspired you?*

There are loads of cartoons and such being passed around during this time, but one hit me in a bad way. The cartoon shows the days of the week, with the "Mon.", "Tues.", "Wed." etc. crossed-out, so that only "day" is left. Spiritually speaking – spiritual life is just another way of saying transcendent life with God/self/others – spiritually speaking, God does not want us to experience life as "day" ala "groundhog day". Instead, we are called to experience life according to the maxim: "each day is a new beginning following in the footsteps of Christ." I encourage you to please reflect on the invitation of God in each new day to renew your faith/hope/love to grow in this experience of the pandemic knowing without a doubt "that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose." (Romans 8,28) I invite you to email me your answers to the questions I posed (wlago@dioceseoftrenton.org) to share with me and other parishioners. Certainly, we have had personal experiences during this time, and you can confidentially share those experiences with me in a spiritual direction conversation, but for the parish-at-large, I wish for you to share the graces amidst the challenges that would be a help and inspiration to others. AN EXCERPT FROM BISHOP O'CONNELL'S LETTER FOR PRIESTS ON DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY:

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, I find some comfort in the "Diary" of St. Faustina:

When I see that the burden is beyond my strength, I do not consider or analyze it or probe into it, but I run like a child to the Heart of Jesus and say only one word to Him: "You can do all things." And then I keep silent, because I know that Jesus Himself will intervene in the matter, and as for me, instead of tormenting myself, I use that time to love Him (1033, page 392)." And in another place there, she quotes the Lord Jesus who revealed to her:

"I am love and mercy itself. There is no misery that could be a match for My mercy, neither will misery exhaust it, because as it is being granted – it increases. The soul that trusts in My mercy is most fortunate, because I Myself take care of it (1273, page 459)."

My brothers, I believe deeply that the world and its cares and challenges — even a pandemic — cannot keep us from the mercy of God and from the presence of Christ. What we experience daily in these days is a call to continued sacrifice. But the passion and death of the Son of God was the path to his resurrection. It is the path that we, as priests, and all the faithful walk now, together.

A HOLY WEEK VIEW FROM THE CONVENT

Sr. Mary Guyer, SSJ

Sr. Mary Guyer, a Sister of Saint Joseph, lives in the convent on the grounds at St. Denis. Life in the convent is a little different these days as normally Sr. Mary would be volunteering at the Religious Ed Program next door, at Mass at the Chapel or visiting friends from her community nearby. But these days, like all of us, Sr. Mary finds herself indoors looking at the world through the windows of her home. The view from the convent was full of the joy and hope of Easter for her this Holy Week as she saw what she can only describe as the "Inspirational Testimony to Our God from the Heart of the People of God." From the St. Denis convent windows on Good Friday Sr. Mary saw a family reflecting on the Passion of the Lord, climbing the outside steps of the church on their knees. On Easter Sunday, she saw a family praying on their knees in front of the statue of Mary outside the school. Still, she saw another family with small children walking the labyrinth of the Stations of the Cross next to the church praying together. All of these witnesses to the great Paschal Mystery of our Lord Jesus Christ filled her heart and connected her to our community with an awesome experience of the Holy days of this Easter season. As we continue to celebrate this Easter Season and the hope that the Resurrection of the Lord brings us, may we all be inspired by Sr. Mary's reflections on the witness of faith that she saw in her view from the convent. Know that we are never alone; we are one in the One who loves us and gave us eternal life in Him.

GRIEF AND LOSS IN THE TIME OF COVID-19

Many aspects of our lives have changed in a very short period of time. Coronavirus has changed our lives in unexpected and unwanted ways. Uncertainty has become a way of life. One aspect of the challenge of living in these times is dealing with death, dying and grief. This is not addressing the threat of death from coronavirus. This is death as it is encountered and experienced in the normal course of human experience. Grief becomes increasingly complicated and painful when the normal rituals and experiences surrounding death and dying are disrupted. During this time of isolation and separation, state and CDC mandates have dictated that no more than ten people may gather in one place. In a hospital, nursing home or hospice setting, this narrows to two people, and then only when the care provider determines that death is imminent.

When people aren't physically present to say goodbye and grieve with other mourners, they may be more likely to experience a sense of ambiguous loss. With an ambiguous loss, it's very hard to get closure. There's often a lot of frustration and helplessness, because people feel disempowered.

In our Catholic tradition, rituals provide structure and predictability in the aftermath of death. Since conducting a traditional funeral is no longer an option in these times, priests seek to give comfort and assure prayers and blessings said that offer the hope of the loved one's share in life everlasting with the hope of a larger Memorial Mass in better future days as families desire. There are no easy answers. What will help is wise intervention to assist someone to walk through the experience of loss and grief.

So how can we construct new ways to help us cope with death and dying for this situation that we're in right now? Since this is all uncharted territory, people go to fill the gap with face timing loved ones in the hospital or holding virtual wakes online through different resources. It may be helpful to remember that some suggestions for supporting those grieving, though not virtual or techno, do still hold much in value of being supportive. Simply being a listening, compassionate presence is often the best method to help someone move through their grief. One to one *intentional* interaction, a phone call or a hand written card/letter can often make more of an impact than you think in our techno centered world. But here are some things to remember when offering support to someone grieving:

- Don't say "It will be okay." (It is not okay and it doesn't really have to be).
- Do not offer advice on a time limit for grief. Some people grieve for the rest of their lives.
- Grief is not a problem to be solved. So LISTEN don't SOLVE
- Don't say: "He/she is in a better place." or "It will get better with time."
- You don't get over grief. Grief is something you learn to live with.

Simply being a listening, compassionate presence is often the best method to help someone move through their grief. Grief is unwelcome but inevitable in our lives. These complicated days certainly will add to the grieving process. But what is very important to remember is that most people experience the biggest drop off of support three to six months after the death of their loved one. So stay mindful of those who have had a death of a loved one change their life. Keep reaching out, calling or letting them know that you are there without any expectation from the person bereaving that they get back to you or will ask you if they need help. Do it today, do it next week and then keep on doing it all year long! Though we may be social distancing, we have no limit on the care, love and concern we can offer throughout these days and throughout the year.

We pray for all the families of our parish and throughout the world who have experienced the death of a loved one in these last weeks. We ask the Lord Jesus Christ to comfort them in their loss made so very complicated during these isolating days. "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted."
