

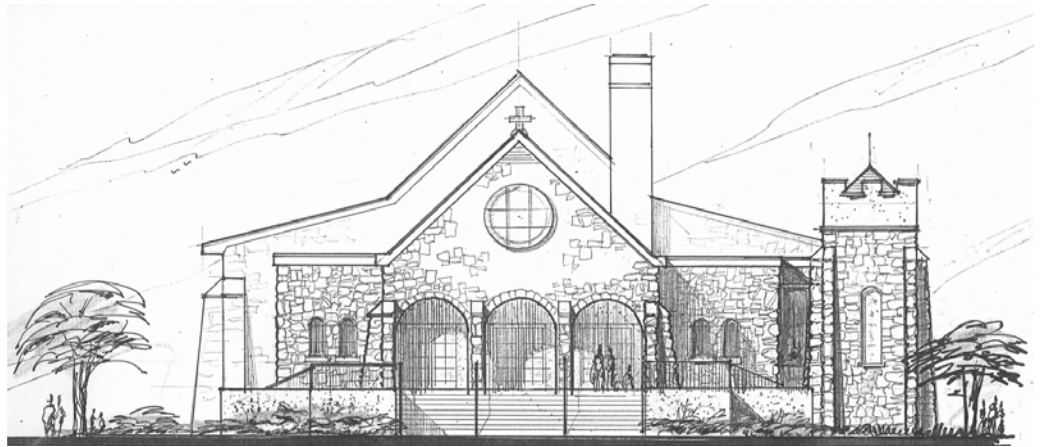
**HIS WORD TODAY**

### MESSAGE FROM FR. BILL

Thank you all for your generosity in last week's collection for the people in the Diocese of Galveston-Houston affected by Hurricane Harvey. In the vain of helping others, as we move into the waning of the Ecumenical Garden for its first year, I share with you a unique "View from the Pew" from Ken O'Brien, one of the ecumenical master gardeners. I invite you to take part in the planning and planting for next year. It has been a great time.

### A View from 'another' Pew: OUR ECUMENICAL GARDEN by Kennedy J O'Brien, a Master Gardener and member of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church

Ethan Thompson, an Eagle Scout from Manasquan Presbyterian Church, began the ecumenical garden and named it "Oma's Garden" in honor of his grandmother. From that honorable beginning, we began with a brief meeting in the office at St. Denis, deciding to enlarge the size of the garden. We were the seeds of an idea getting together for the first time with the objective of raising food for folks in the community. The Manasquan Ministerium churches yielded gardeners from Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, the Roman Catholic Church of St. Denis, the United Methodist Church, and First Presbyterian Church. It was early May and already we were feeling a little behind schedule. But we had a team and we had some real estate--and we were infused with energy from the Holy Spirit--eager to play in the dirt.

Our major crop is tomatoes and among the varieties are: black krim, sweet 100s (cherry), Rutgers and yellow tomatoes. There are excellent crops of bell peppers, lettuce, radishes, beans, peas, beets, cucumbers, cantaloupe melon, zucchini & butternut squash, carrots, sweet potatoes, broccoli, onions, spinach, basil and cilantro. A large portion of our squash crop was unfortunately decimated by the squash vine borer but a few plants were saved and hopefully they will produce. All vegetables are donated to the community food bank (at St. Denis and Manasquan Presbyterian) and are delivered fresh within 24 hours (or less) of harvest.

Our team meets twice a week on Monday evenings at ~ 5:30 p.m. and Saturday mornings at ~ 9:30 a.m. for about an hour; volunteers come to help when they can. There is a shared watering schedule as well. While activities in the garden have previously focused on tilling, planting, weeding and watering, our focus right now is harvesting. Our harvests to date have totaled over 230 pounds!

Our efforts are backed by numerous, generous supporters who have made donations to the garden in the forms of: plants, seeds, compost, fencing materials, tomato cages & stakes to keep the tomato vines and fruit off the ground, including Barlows and Allenwood Organics.

We will soon be starting to make plans for our fall initiatives which will include (among others): planting a fall crop, soliciting additional volunteers, and drafting plans for an educational program to teach gardening fundamentals and foster an appreciation for the knowledge and skills necessary to use the gifts God has given us to raise crops.

The beauty of our garden is a site to behold - a moment quietly and invisibly forging ahead - changing in front of our eyes without notice. DNA insuring perfect roots, stems, leaves and flowers; chlorophyll capturing single photons radiating from a star 93 million miles away; the carbon dioxide we jettison recycling into plant matter providing food and oxygen. We are humbled by the simple complexity of our Lord's plant kingdom. So, in a small plot of land off Route 71, we gather as friends. Our friendship generates the spirit of a team for the welfare of a community. Our ecumenical garden is a spiritual place created by the glory of God the Father, blessed by the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and nourished by the fellowship of the Holy Spirit.

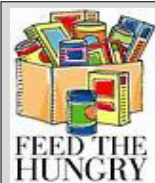

In today's Gospel, Jesus says: "... where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them." Is there a family you know who needs assistance? Please call the Society of St. Vincent de Paul so that together we help them to know that indeed "God is in the midst of them."

Blessed Frederic Ozanam's feast day is celebrated on September 9<sup>th</sup>. He lived from 1813 to 1853, and is recognized as the prime founder of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Blessed Frederic was that rare individual who exhibits both intellectual genius and extraordinary holiness. Husband and father, professor and researcher, journalist and author, apologist and defender of the faith, he was, above all, a Good Samaritan.

One Saturday morning, Frederic and his friends were confronted by a fellow student, and found it difficult to answer his challenge: "What are you and your Church doing today to meet the needs of society?" Frederic and his companions knew that they must concretize their faith in action, that they must evangelize like the apostles: not only by words, but by the constant practice of charity. Frederic rallied them with this exhortation: "The blessing of the poor is that of God ... let us go to the poor."

On April 23, 1833, his twentieth birthday, Frederic and five other students met with their mentor, Emmanuel Bailly, in the office of The Catholic Tribune. There they established the "Conference of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul," soon to be called "The Society of St. Vincent de Paul,"
