



A MESSAGE FROM FATHER BILL

First, a big thank you to all involved in our St. Denis Parish Feast Day Spaghetti Dinner. It was the most highly attended social event since my arrival. So many great people helped to put it together and so many lively, happy and energetic people attended! The atmosphere was so joyful and I am thankful to God for the blessing it is for our parish. I am also thankful to Police Chief Bauer and his wife, along with Patrolmen Tantum and Louhier who attended as part of the Faith-and-Blue initiative. These invited guests met with parishioners with the purpose of further building connections in the community through interactions with faith-based groups...and also enjoyed a great meal. (On Sunday Sgt. Stopera was present at our Beach Chapel Mass where he also met with parishioners, whom he sees quite often as he attends Mass there too.)

Secondly, I share with you the annual Fiscal Year Report. This report is for the fiscal year from July 2021 to June 2022. I want to look at some major points of the financial picture of the parish as I extend my gratitude for all your monetary support for the parish and the temporal aspect of our parish mission.

We continue to make great strides in eliminating the parish debt. By continuing to pay down the debt aggressively, we decreased the mortgage balance by \$212,000. This strategy allowed the parish to save \$13,000 on debt interest! Our weekly collections increased \$40,000 (or 6%) over the previous year: THANK YOU. (I believe the factors leading to this include: the increase of weekly attendance since the Covid shutdown; the increase in online giving; and the continual donations mailed in each week.) Parishioners have also taken to heart our parish "building repairs and maintenance" collection and have donated generously. This fund directly goes to this required area of continual need. THANK YOU. We also received a few beguests this year (one of which was nearly \$150,500). I am so grateful for the parishioners who remember the parish in their will, and I ask you to consider such a gift as well, if you are able. We have moved forward with the diocese for the use of the convent for recently retired priests to live there. This arrangement will not only lead to a cancellation of the \$2.1 million dollars that the parish owes the diocese for debt accrued from the running of the school, but will actively bring down some operating costs as they take over the utilities and help with some grounds and upkeep. (I am very grateful to Sr. Mary, who moved to the convent at St. Rose and continues to volunteer in our Religious Education Program.)

Like all of you, our parish is challenged by rising insurance, utility, and operating expenses. I still look for ways to generate revenue for the parish (my candle idea and the 50/50 have raised thousands of dollars to help the cause). I also still look for ways to save money. (I am so grateful to the men and women volunteers who do everything from office work to yard work; volunteering translates into thousands of dollars saved by not having to hire someone to do this work.) Once again, I need to extend a well-deserved THANK YOU to the members of the parish finance council who are truly invested in the well-being of the parish and devote so much time and talent to their mission and share a wealth of advice and freely give generous support to me in my role as Secretary/Treasurer of the corporation that is our parish. Once again thank you for your financial support and I ask of your prayers for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in all the decisions I must make as pastor.


