“Jesus sat down opposite the treasury and observed how the crowd put money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents. Calling His disciples to Himself, He said to them, ‘Amen I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributions to the treasury. For they have contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood.’”

The scriptures feature widows and their gifts. A few drops of oil and a little flour, or two cents. What could these simple elements teach us? Don't be too quick to judge. Consider the state of life, without husbands, with their own felt needs. Yet these simple gifts represented them, their life, perhaps their family too. But the Lord recognized their willingness to give of themselves.

How often when we are asked to support our church do we calculate, complain, and even feel insulted that we are asked to give? Whose church is it? It is mine and the Lord's. What do I have that was not a gift for me? Nothing. Many times when a parent is carrying his shoeless baby when leaving church I ask another person if they have a dollar. Readily they reach to answer my request. We then joke that the people did have shoes. They respond as we should, like today's widows.

Today we hear in the Gospel Jesus' observation of the donations made into the collection box. He contrasts the wealthy and their sizeable contributions with the very modest amount put in by the poor widow. He says that the wealthy are giving from their abundance whereas the widow gave from what she lived on—"giving from her want". It is not the size of the gift which measures its value, but rather the depth of the self-giving from which it comes. Discipleship doesn't necessarily mean that we do big and heroic things (although that is fine, too!) - it does mean that we do everything, as we follow Jesus, with hearts set right. We give of ourselves for the good of others. When we give our time, our goods, or money-with hearts set right—we are being disciples of Jesus.

A Message from Fr. Bill:

Last week we hosted one of the Diocesan Guadalupe Torches. In this third annual month-long pilgrimage, fifteen torches, blessed by the Bishop, travel throughout the four counties of the diocese and reunite in Trenton in December as we prepare to celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Here at Saint Denis, at the evening Mass on All Saints Day, the torch was ushered in by a dancing troupe in festive costume. The torch was placed before an image of Our Lady of Guadalupe and stayed with us overnight until the torch continued on its journey.

We are fortunate that, as Catholics, we have so many ways in which to honor God and celebrate our faith. Since I was young, I always appreciated how blessed we are in the United States to be a “melting pot” of Catholic culture. Sure, I might have not used those words back then, but as a Slovak-Irish Catholic raised in an Italian Catholic parish (Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Asbury Park), I did find great personal pride and identity in all that this meant for me. The unique celebrations of all the nationalities that have embraced Catholicism help us to be formed in the faith and united in our diversity. I might not be Italian, but I grew up with blessed bread on St. Anthony Day and a very developed sense of patron saints.

As Patroness of the Americas, Our Lady of Guadalupe, has the great power to unite all of us, regardless of our background of nationality, because Our Lady of Guadalupe is patroness of us all here in America. I felt a pride in our Church as I watched the dancers praise God as they processed with the torch, not because I am of Hispanic origin, but because I am of Catholic origin. “Catholic” means universal—firstly because of the universal teaching of our Lord Jesus necessary for salvation; and secondly, Jesus’ invitation to discipleship is universally world-wide and found amongst all nations. Let us celebrate, and even more, encourage in the young people in our lives, the unique celebrations in our faith which help us know we belong to a great Church with a Universal King. In a few weeks we will have our St. Nicholas Festival, which I brought here for this particular reason – so that the children of our parish would understand our Catholic heritage and come to know the different stories and customs surrounding St. Nicholas. I hope families might include some of these customs in their own homes to build faith and memories in the domestic church, as we celebrate our customs in the parish church here at St. Denis.
