“Say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! Here is your God, he comes with vindication; with divine recompense he comes to save you. Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf will be cleared; then will the lame leap like a stag, then the tongue of the dumb will sing.... They will meet with joy and gladness; sorrow and mourning will flee.”

Take a minute to reflect on what the prophet Isaiah has to say. Centuries before Christ he offered a solution to peoples' problems with words of encouragement and hope. In our advent season we need such words to help us resist what pulls us down and discover ways to long for and meet our Savior. Although he uses images of physical healing we need to apply them to our spiritual well being. Our eyes are to be fixed on Jesus, our ears open to His call to renewal, walking in His company, and speaking of His coming and abiding with us. With Him there can be joy and gladness. With Him sorrow and mourning will flee.

**THE SOCIETY OF
ST. VINCENT DE PAUL**



Vincent de Paul was canonized by Pope Clement XII in 1737, but Pope Leo XIII honored him as patron saint of all charitable societies in 1885. It was the deathbed confession of a dying servant which opened Vincent's eyes to the crying spiritual needs of the peasantry of France. This was a crucial moment in the life of a man from a small farm in France, who originally became a priest with little more purpose than to have a comfortable life. The Countess de Gondi-whose servant he had helped-persuaded her husband to endow and support a group of missionaries who would work among the poor tenant farmers and country folk. After working for some time in Paris among imprisoned galley slaves, Vincent returned to be the leader of that group-now known as the Congregation of the Mission, or the Vincentians. These priests, with vows of poverty, chastity, obedience and stability, were to devote themselves entirely to the people in small towns and villages. Later, Vincent established confraternities of charity for the spiritual and physical relief of the poor and sick of each parish. From these, with the help of Louise de Marillac, came the Daughters of Charity to help the sick in the city. He organized the rich women of Paris to collect funds for his missionary projects, founded several hospitals, collected relief funds for the victims of war, and ransomed over 1200 galley slaves from North Africa. He was also zealous in conducting retreats for clergy at a time when there was great laxity, abuse and ignorance among them. Remarkably, Vincent was by temperament a quick tempered and testy person-even his friends said so. He said later in life that except for the grace of God he would have been "hard and repulsive, rough and cross." But, he became a tender and affectionate man, very sensitive to the needs of others, and would become the patron saint of our Society which bears his name.

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER BILL

Happy Gaudete Sunday! As we rejoice in the nearness of our God and the nearness of our celebration of Christmas, we realize the great gift of time given to us in Advent and realize we have two more (full) weeks to use the time of Advent for our spiritual enrichment.

As we come to the end of the calendar year, I wish to share some developments on the fiscal and spiritual sides of our parish life and look to the New Year as well. This week I share the "behind the scenes" decisions for our buildings and grounds.

We have recently completed a "technology project" for our school. We upgraded our technology and installed smart TVs in all the rooms which will benefit our (over 500) students as well as the adults participating in our growing number of programs. This project has been largely funded through a generous donation from a parishioner who has matched dollar-for-dollar the donations we asked from parents of our religious education students. We ask parents who have not yet donated to please do so by December 16th. We are also planning a "sound-system upgrade project" for St. Denis Church. We all know that the system has been having difficulties and now is the time for us to work on fixing that problem. This project comes with a price tag of \$27,000. I am hoping that through our Christmas Collection and a separate fund drive for our January-February "Buildings and Maintenance Collection" we can afford this project. I would have done this project sooner, but the boiler in the gym (which I have prayed to get us through the last two years) had to be replaced this fall and required my attention to fund first, in the priority of it all. If you would like to donate to the sound-system upgrade, please donate to the Buildings and Maintenance fund in the collection or on-line.

To finish up this end-of-the-year sharing, I want to remind you that the parish has signed a three-year contract with the Borough of Manasquan for the continued use of the gym for the town's recreation department. We have also signed a twenty-year lease with the Diocese for the use of the convent for a residence for priests who will be recently retired and also willing to help out at parishes in our area. These contracts greatly help our parish advancement where it counts – building the Kingdom of God, through our prayer, parish life, and community outreach, which we pray, is directed to the Glory of God.

National Eucharistic Revival
