RITE OF CHRISTIAN BURIAL: At such times of deep pain and loss, we seek to offer our bereaved families comfort and hope as they commend their loved ones to God. Please note that, in accordance with Church regulations, eulogies are not permitted during Funeral Masses.

RECTORY OFFICE HOURS: Monday-Thursday 8:30 AM-12:00 noon & 1:00 PM- 4:30 PM, Friday 8:30 AM- 12:00 noon only. There are no office hours on Saturday & Sunday. Evenings are by appointment only.

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER BILL

Happy New Year! And, Happy Feast of the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. On the octave (8th day) of Christmas, we celebrate and thank God for Mary, the Mother of God and our spiritual mother too! A few thank yous: Thanks to Bob Olson and his team for decorating the church; thanks to the Dingley Families for decorating the rectory office, thanks to Deacons Gary and George for their preparations, decorations and ministry for the holy days; and thank all at the 4:30 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass for their full cooperation during the water-pipe break and all that occurred afterwards; special thanks to those who jumped into action for the responses that were needed.

As we begin the New Year, I pause to look back at the spiritual life of our parish in 2022. I want to share with you some numbers which give an indication of what has been occurring:

In addition, we have celebrated the Sacraments of Healing – Confession and Anointing of the Sick – many times throughout the year; and many more people have taken the opportunity to come and talk with me spiritually, about their everyday experiences and their relationship with God. I am also grateful to the outreach that Eileen Ziesmer provides through her speaking with people and the bereavement counseling she does. Also, thanks to Kerry O’Connell who helps families prepare spiritually for the funerals of their loved ones in such a caring, faithful and hopeful way.

Our spiritual life at St. Denis has also been growing through our Religious Education program with the over 440 children in our program (thanks to all involved in teaching and coordinating this great endeavor). In addition, this year we have implemented the request that the parents attend at least two different faith enrichment programs throughout the year. Our already rich adult faith enrichment program has been added to by the Catholic Daughters of the Americas who have contributed a Lenten and Advent period of reflection. Our men’s and women’s faith sharing groups have also grown over this year, and I am so thankful to the participants who have told me what a difference these groups have made in their lives. We have also increased our prayer life through the ministry of the prayer groups we have in our parish who dedicate time to pray for all parishioners and have added a petition book (located by our stained-glass window of St. Denis, and the statues of Mary and Joseph) to pray for specific petitions throughout the year.

As we look forward to the New Year, we hope, with God’s grace, to continue to strengthen the Spiritual Life of our parish, and we need you! It is still the Christmas Season, give yourself a gift – come to one of our spiritual enrichment programs, “come and see” our Men’s Group, Walking with Purpose, Catholic Daughters, or Rosary Altar Society. This year we will continue offering prayer and reflection on the gift of the Holy Eucharist during these years of the Eucharistic Revival in the Church in the U.S. Experience the faith community fellowship and the power of Jesus’ words – Where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am present – in the groups listed, as well as the Knights of Columbus, St. Vincent de Paul Society and the Grandparent Guild. We have so many opportunities to grow spiritually and lend your faith, hope and love to the spiritual growth of St. Denis Parish.
