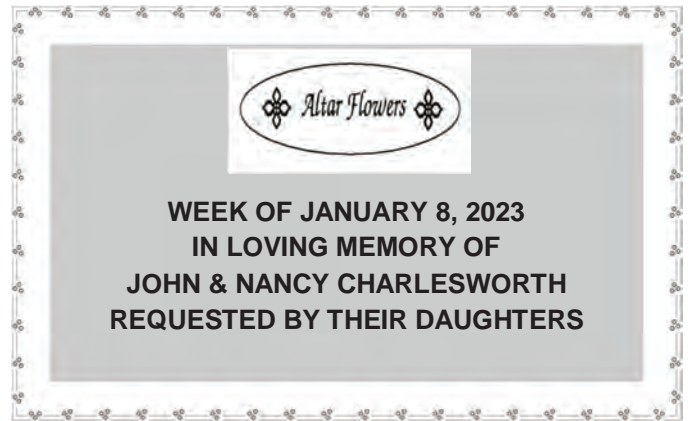

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER BILL

Happy Feast of the Epiphany! As we celebrate the fact that the birth of Our Lord Jesus is meant for all peoples of the earth, we reflect on the ways that God continually guides us to Himself and pray that others will also be open to the “star” God puts in their lives to guide them to a life with God in it. With the way that the calendar fell this year, on Monday we will celebrate another Epiphany - the Baptism of the Lord. Usually celebrated on a Sunday, this is the last feature of our celebration of the Christmas Season. So, this year, we enter into Ordinary Time this Tuesday and stay in that season until Ash Wednesday, 22 February.

As the Church concludes its period of mourning the death of Pope Emeritus Benedict the XVI, I share with you a quote from his homily on the occasion of the inaugural Mass of his pontificate. I pray that it be taken to heart by every person and that its truth be the “star” that guides every human person. “Only when we meet the living God in Christ do we know what life is. We are not some casual and meaningless product of evolution. * Each of us is the result of a thought of God. Each of us is willed, each of us is loved, each of us is necessary. There is nothing more beautiful than to be surprised by the Gospel, by the encounter with Christ. There is nothing more beautiful than to know Him and to speak to others of our friendship with Him. ...God’s joy longs to break into the world.”

(* Please note, by this statement, Pope Benedict did not mean to say that the Church is ignorant of the science of the theory of evolution, contrary to this thought -that many ignorant people use as a false argument against Catholicism and faith - Pope Benedict articulates the harmony of faith and reason by arguing against interpretations of faith that denies God’s reasonableness and against interpretations of rationality that denies faith’s reasonableness; Benedict taught the harmony of faith and reason. The Catholic Church has infallibly defined that the universe was specially created out of nothing. Concerning biological evolution, the Church does not have an official position on whether various life forms developed over the course of time (i.e. the theory of evolution). However, it says that, if they did develop, then they did so under the impetus and guidance of God, and their ultimate creation must be ascribed to him. The Church has a more definite teaching with regards to humans, allowing for the possibility that man’s *body* developed from previous biological forms, under God’s guidance, but we believe there is the *special creation* of each person’s *soul*. Pope Benedict is saying that, in no circumstances do we have belief in atheistic evolution – which would be “casual and meaningless”. God gives meaning to our lives – all the time and in every situation.)
