THE SOCIETY OF
ST. VINCENT DE PAUL



Vincent de Paul was canonized by Pope Clement X11 in 1737 but Pope Leo X111 honored him as patron saint of all charitable societies in 1885. It was the deathbed confession of a dying servant which opened Vincent's eyes to the crying spiritual needs of the peasantry of France. This was a crucial moment in the life of a man from a small farm in France, who originally became a priest with little more purpose than to have a comfortable life. The Countess de Gondi whose servant he had helped persuaded her husband to endow and support a group of missionaries who would work among the poor tenant farmers and country folk. After working for some time in Paris among imprisoned galley slaves. Vincent returned to be the leader of the group, now known as the Congregation of the Mission, or The Vincentians. These priests, with vows of poverty, chastity, obedience and stability, were to devote themselves entirely to the people in small towns and villages. Later, Vincent established confraternities of charity for the spiritual and physical relief of the poor and sick of each parish. From these, with the help of Louise de Marillac, came the Daughters of Charity to help the sick in the city. He organized the rich women of Paris to collect funds for his missionary projects, founded several hospitals, collected relief funds for the victims of war, and ransomed over 1200 galley slaves from North Africa. He was also zealous in conducting retreats for clergy at a time when there was great laxity, abuse and ignorance among them. Remarkably, Vincent was by temperament a quick tempered and testy person, even his friends said so. He said later in life that except for the grace of God he would have been "hard and repulsive, rough and cross". But he became a tender and affectionate man, very sensitive to the needs of others, and would become the patron saint of our society.

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER BILL

As the national website relates: Faith & Blue was inaugurated in 2020 by Movement Forward, Inc., working with the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS Office) at the U.S. Department of Justice. The idea was a simple but powerful one, the ties that bind officers and residents must be reinforced if we are to build neighborhoods where everyone feels safe and included. Faith-based organizations are key to building these bonds because they are not only the largest community resource in the nation, with 65 million participants in weekly events, but because they are as diverse as our nation. Moreover, they speak to Americans’ shared conviction that we are our brothers’ and sisters’ keepers.

Faith & Blue was launched to facilitate safer, stronger, more just and unified communities by directly enabling local partnerships among law enforcement professionals, residents, businesses and community groups through the connections of local faith-based organizations. The initiative aims to re-calibrate police-community relations through solutions focused, in-person, socially distanced and/or virtual activities that are organized jointly by faith-based or other community groups and law enforcement agencies. Communities are stronger and safer when residents and law enforcement professionals can relate as ordinary people with shared values, hopes, and dreams. The partners who are a part of National Faith & Blue Weekend believe we can find ways to work together around our many commonalities instead of being divided by our differences.

Our Monmouth County Prosecutors Office is very strong in their focus to encourage this initiative in our county. The police chiefs of Manasquan and Sea Girt have asked the Manasquan Ministerium to take part, and we will, once again be hosting “Worship Weekends” where members of the police departments will attend worship services and have the opportunity to meet people in our various congregations. I am happy to say that our inaugural year led to much success. The collaboration between the pastors of our ministerium and the chiefs of police resulted in the strongest Faith and Blue effort in the county. I ask that you please support this effort and take part in the other Faith and Blue events that will be planned during this second year. I am personally inviting you all to the Toy Drive in December! Stay tuned. Last year, we had a great time for a great cause, and I hope you will come out and spend some time at the event this year.
