

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER BILL

We celebrate the Feast Day of Sts. Joachim and Anne, grandparents of Jesus (26 July), and the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. The theme for the 2024 celebration selected by the Pope is "Do not cast me off in my old age" (cf. Psalm 71:9). We pray for our grandparents and those seniors in our life who have helped us on our faith journey and we renew our pledge to help them, as we can, with their needs with their grandchildren. I am thankful to our Grandparents Guild who reach out to grandparents of our parish, as well as grandparents attending the baptisms held at St. Denis. In place of the self-centered attitude that leads to loneliness and abandonment, let us instead show the open heart and the joyful face of men and women who have the courage to say "I will not abandon you".

We will be having a summer-time altar server training on Tuesday, 13 August from 4-5:30pm in the church. All students who have already received First Holy Communion are eligible. Grandparents are encouraged to encourage their grandchild to become an altar server – a major milestone in the life of Catholic children in their participation in Mass and other Liturgies of the Church. For older students, in 5th-8th grade, this is a great opportunity to grow in service of God and neighbor, as you prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation. I cannot speak enough about what it means for a student to participate in altar serving. I can speak of it in terms of spiritual, social, and psychological development. Sports can not provide all of this. A student grows in the spiritual sense by being up-close to the celebration of the Mystery of the Mass. They must pay more attention, so they get more out of the Mass, plus learn concentration skills. They not only learn cooperative work with their peers but also work side-by-side with the priest and deacon in the most important work of the Catholic Church – worship of God and following the command of Christ to "do this in memory of me." In so doing, children, even introverts, grow in self-confidence and self-possession – important life skills. They learn to critically think and give their best in the moment, knowing that they are a part of something much larger than themselves; they share in the everlasting victory of Christ, which has infinite merit that will last into eternity.

NATURAL FAMILY PLANNING- The natural methods of family planning (NFP) do *not* depend on a woman having "regular" menstrual cycles. NFP information treats each woman and each cycle as unique. NFP teaches a woman to watch every day for her signs of fertility. NFP therefore works with menstrual cycles of any length and any degree of irregularity. It can be used during breastfeeding, just before menopause, and in other special circumstances. NFP allows a woman to understand the physical signals her body gives her to tell her when she is most likely to become pregnant. (See: *NFP*, *Myth and Reality*, NFP Program, U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops).




