"The Lord said to Moses: 'You shall not bear hatred for your brother or sister in vour heart... Take revenge and cherish no grudge against any of your people. You shall love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord.... So be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect."

Jesus cited this passage from Leviticus when He taught us to love God above all things, with heart, soul, strength and mind, and indicated we do this when we care for our neighbor. In our world, where diversity can be a gift, we are plagued by war, hate, racism and discrimination in so many ways. How distant from the gospel mandate.



A MESSAGE FROM FATHER BILL

Lent begins this Wednesday. Our parish's theme: "Embrace the Uniqueness of Lent." As disciples of Jesus our Messiah, we are thankful to God for the uniqueness of our Catholic spirituality that gives us 40 days of Lent patterned after our Lord's 40 days of temptation in the desert. We embrace the unique privilege to "go into the dessert" with Jesus. We also need to embrace the uniqueness of our journey. God deals with us uniquely. It is logical, since no two people are identical, that God, like any parent, loves each person uniquely. Jesus says we <u>must</u> be "salt of the earth and light for the world" and each of us do this uniquely. "Each day we make a new beginning following in the footsteps of Christ." In Lent, that "new beginning" is not just a new day, but also a renewed commitment to following Christ "giving it all we've got".

With that in mind, I look at a popular challenge today on social media - "75 Hard." From the author, Andy Frisella, "75 Hard" is about building mental toughness so as to change the way you approach every task in front of you. One's commitment to the 75-day challenge is to show you the following traits in yourself: confidence, self-esteem, self-worth, self-belief, and fortitude. You choose to follow the program perfectly and without compromise.

Concept sound familiar? Lent is "40 Hard", 40 days with Jesus in the desert that He humbly submitted to perfectly and without compromise. Each disciple is meant to commit, without compromise, to the traditions of Lent – fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. We "give up" and "add on" in order to build mental toughness, which then translates into spiritual toughness (as disciples) so to re-approach our God-given identity, so to approach every task in front of us thru/with/in Jesus. We approach each task in front of us as a Confirmed Disciple – thus having the God-given traits of confidence, self-esteem, self-worth, God-belief/self-belief, and fortitude. For 40 days this Lent I ask you to take a 'hard' look at your identity as being Baptized/Confirmed in Christ and sharing Communion in Him. Take a 'hard' look at how God sees you with love, at God extending mercy and forgiveness to you. Take a 'hard' look at how you can actualize your hopeful approach to your self-esteem and self-worth because of God making us in God's image and likeness. Take a 'hard look' at how you were created for a definite reason. And take a 'hard look' at the Scripture phrase "I can do all things through God who strengthens me." In Lent, you take on mental toughness through daily commitment to concrete acts of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving: following the Church's guidelines (see the insert in this bulletin) and also the guidelines God is calling you to this Lent, remembering it is meant to build you up, not stress you out. (For a wholistic look, see last week's bulletin or other aides to Lent we hand out this week).

The "75 Hard" author writes: "There's nothing worse than rolling through life in the passenger's seat. You wake up, go to work, and drift through each day with no direction or driving force … You start doubting yourself … Your thoughts beat you up every minute of the day to the point where you feel like you'll always be stuck right where you are in this funk forever." God does not want this for you at all. God gives us Lent to bless us and transform us and get out of any 'funk' we may be in (body/mind/spirit). God wants us to deepen our faith/hope/love. Embrace the uniqueness of Lent this year. And let us pray for each other for the grace to live Lent to the fullest for the glory of God and our spiritual strength thru/with/in Jesus.



WALK WITH MARY ON HER WAY OF THE

CROSS.... At the Annunciation, it was announced to Mary, to her surprise and awe as a mere teenager, that she was chosen by God to be the Mother of God's only Son. Rooted in an unwavering faith in

God and in God's plan, her human response to that divine call was a life changing, world changing "YES!". 
